

## Concepts in Advanced Trauma Nursing: A Conceptual Approach

### Course Description:

Recognizing a need for a course in advanced trauma nursing, the Emergency Nurses Association developed the *Course in Advanced Trauma Nursing: A Conceptual Approach*. This is an innovative continuing education program which combines didactic content with case studies and interactive discussions to correlate broad physiologic/pathophysiologic concepts to specific clinical problems.

### Course Participants:

The *Course in Advanced Trauma Nursing: A Conceptual Approach* may be officially attended only by Registered Nurses. Course participants are expected to be familiar with core anatomy and physiology. It is recommended that participants have completed the Trauma Nursing Core Course (TNCC) and have at least two years of emergency or critical care trauma experience. Regardless of clinical background, it is highly recommended that participants read the CATN manual prior to attending the course.

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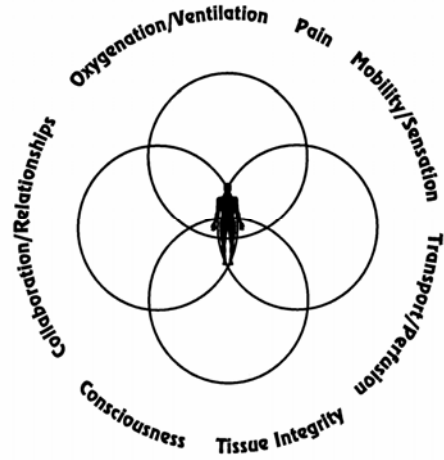
### CANCELLATION POLICY
